

Eugeniu Pastea (1920-1993), Veterinarian, Prof. Dr. Docent in Sciences, Laureate of the State Prize. Graduate of the Medical and Military Institute of Bucharest, Faculty of Veterinary Medicine in 1945, became a professor at the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, the Agronomic Institute of Bucharest in 1949, ascending all hierarchical steps to full professor in 1970, teaching the subjects "Anatomy and Physiology of Domestic Animals" and "Anatomy, Histology and Embryology of Domestic Animals". In 1947 he became a "Doctor in Veterinary Medicine" and in 1965 a "Docent Doctor in Sciences". His exceptional contributions refer to: comparative anatomy, histology, embryology, topography, surgery, semiotics, surgical therapeutics, traumatology, orthopedics and podology sidero-tehnics, ophthalmology, oto-rhino-laryngology and dentistry, taxidermia, deontology, atlases of comparative anatomy and dictionaries of zootechnics and veterinary medicine. He published: 30 treatises, textbooks, courses, 16 applied didactic works, and also 260 scientific papers, of which 24 abroad in prestigious journals. Among the most important works there are: Anatomy and Physiology of domestic animals (1952), The Basics of Surgery and Semiotics of Surgery (1953), The General Surgical Therapy (1953), The Atlas of Comparative Anatomy (1954, 1958), Analysis of the central nervous system and neuro-vegetative of animals (1956), Veterinary Orthopedics (1958), Veterinary Deontology (1972), Practical Atlas of Veterinary Anatomy (1979 in 4 languages), Comparative Anatomy of Domestic Animals (1985), Taxidermia (1987), Topographic Anatomy of Cattle (1990, atlas in 5 languages).
